

In less than two years, SFBC&TS's associate's degree in psychology teaches you about the mind, body, and spirit through professors who are committed to your spiritual and academic success with a curriculum that is centered on Christ.

The Associate of Arts degree is awarded to students who have completed a minimum of sixty credit hours of study or its equivalent in the area of psychology. This degree usually marks the halfway point to the baccalaureate degree.

FORMAT + SCHEDULE

The 60-credit curriculum of the A.A. in Psychology program consists of 20 courses which build upon each other to achieve the program objectives.
